

Watergate Salad

Ingredients:

2 packages instant pistachio pudding mix
2 cans crushed pineapple, with juice
1 bag of miniature marshmallows
1/2 cup chopped walnuts
1 container frozen whipped topping, thawed

How to Prepare:

In a large bowl, mix together pudding mix, pineapple with juice, marshmallows, nuts, and whipped topping. Chill for about 2 hours.

Prep Time: 10 minutes
Chill Time: 2 hours

HOT CHOCOLATE

Ingredients:

2 cups hot milk
2 unsweetened chocolate squares, cut in pieces
1/4 cup sugar
2 tablespoons instant coffee crystals
1 dash salt
2 cups cold milk
1/2 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon

How to Prepare:

1. Combine hot milk, chocolate, sugar, coffee and salt in a blender. Cover, blend at high speed, until chocolate is melted and sugar dissolves.
2. In a large saucepan, combine blended ingredients with remaining ingredients. Heat, stirring constantly. Blend small amounts of hot mixture just before serving.

Prince: June 7, 1958 – April 27, 2016






Alan Rickman: February 21, 1946 – January 14, 2016
